

### Introduction

Shalom and greetings in the name of Yahusha our Savior! This calendar has been placed on my heart to make available to anyone who desires to walk as our perfect example walked; according to the Torah of Yahuah Tseva'oth, our Father. All Feast Days and Sabbaths are conducted evening to evening (sunset to sunset). The weekly Sabbath is from Friday at sunset to Saturday at sunset. For more information and justification for celebrating this way, click this

Please note, we have used a Gregorian calendar only for an easy reference point. The further we get away from the papal calendar, the better.


We have also included the New Moon's for each new month, as according to the scriptures, the new moon sliver starts the monthly cycle. For more information on this, you may refer to the "Calculating the Feast Days" study. For the New Moon celebration, it is conducted by viewing the first visible phase at sunset. We do not believe the New Moon is to be observed as a Sabbath day, as there is no direct scripture that says so. It is a day for gathering together with other followers of the way, sharing food, scriptures, prayer, and song to honor Yahuah and plenty of shofar blowing!

Make sure to check the bookmark tabs to quickly navigate the calendar years.

### How To Read this Calendar



Yom Teruah (Feast of Trumpets) is a perfect example for us. Take a look at the 7<sup>th</sup> day of the month on the Gregorian calendar. You'll see how it correlates to Thursday. However, since the true day is calculated from sunset to sunset – the first day of the month is from Thursday at evening (a portion of Thursday) to Friday at sunset (shown as the darker shade of green). All feast days operate like this. Likewise, you'll also notice the Sabbath (lightest shade of green) is from Friday at sundown to Saturday at sundown.



Now take a look at Yom Kippur. You'll see that Yom Kippur starts on the evening of the 16<sup>th</sup> (Saturday night) and continues into Sunday the 17<sup>th</sup>. Beneath each month, there will be a written detail of pertinent information, so if anything looks confusing on the calendar, you can reference that as well.
